- 1. Vary your withdrawal patterns, and avoid making large cash withdrawals on a regular schedule.
- 2. Be aware of your surroundings when using bank services, and avoid displaying cash or valuables in public.
- 3. Don't leave your vehicle unlocked or your windows rolled down while parked at a bank.
- 4. Be cautious of strangers approaching you in or near a bank, especially if they ask personal questions or offer unsolicited assistance.
- 5. Use drive-thru services whenever possible, and keep your car in gear and your doors locked while waiting in line.
- 6. Report any suspicious activity to bank personnel or law enforcement immediately.
- 7. Avoid carrying large sums of cash or expensive jewelry, and keep your valuables out of sight.
- 8. Use a secure deposit box at the bank for storing valuables instead of keeping them in your home.
- 9. Be aware of vehicles with dark tint, sitting with multiple occupants, or changing parking spaces for no reason.
